

This document provides a high-level overview for the typical election deadlines for the general election in November based on our understanding as of August 3, 2020. The information reflects the deadlines for domestic, non-military voters to request or return a mail-in ballot with a focus on mail related deadlines. There may be different deadlines for other forms of voter participation, such as in person, or for military or overseas voters. There are exceptions to these rules not reflected below. The document does not reflect all the requirements that must be satisfied for a ballot to be counted. Any specific questions regarding a state's laws should be directed to the appropriate state election official.
