

MOTION TO RECOMMIT

M____. _____ moves to recommit the bill, H.R. 624, to the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with the following amendments:

At the end of the bill, add the following new section:

1 **SEC. ____ . PROTECTING THE PRIVACY OF INTERNET PASS-**
2 **WORDS AND THE CREATIVITY OF THE INTER-**
3 **NET.**

4 Nothing in this Act or the amendments made by this
5 Act shall be construed to—

6 (1) permit an employer, a prospective employer,
7 or the Federal Government to require the disclosure
8 of a confidential password for a social networking
9 website or a personal account of an employee or job
10 applicant without a court order; or

11 (2) permit the Federal Government to establish
12 a mechanism to control United States citizens' ac-
13 cess to and use of the Internet through the creation
14 of a national Internet firewall similar to the “Great
15 Internet Firewall of China”, as determined by the
16 Director of the National Intelligence.

In section 2(c)(1)(F) of the bill (as inserted by the amendment offered by Mr. McCaul), strike “; and” and insert a semicolon.

In section 2(c)(1)(G) of the bill (as inserted by the amendment offered by Mr. McCaul), strike the period and insert a semicolon.

At the end of section 2(c)(1) of the bill (as inserted by the amendment offered by Mr. McCaul), add the following new subparagraphs:

- 1 (H) the number of Americans who have—
2 (i) been required by employers, pro-
3 spective employers, or the Federal Govern-
4 ment to release confidential passwords for
5 social networking websites; and
6 (ii) had personal information released
7 to the Federal Government under this sec-
8 tion or obtained in connection with a cy-
9 bersecurity breach; and
10 (I) the impact of the information that has
11 been released or obtained as referred to in sub-
12 paragraph (H) on privacy, electronic commerce,
13 Internet usage, and online content.
