Securing the Border & Protecting American Communities

- 1. Alexis Nungaray**— Alexis Nungaray is the mother of Jocelyn Nungaray, a 12-year-old girl who was tragically murdered by illegal aliens in June of 2024. Jocelyn's life was tragically cut short because of the Biden Administration's failure to close our borders and protect American citizens from dangerous illegal aliens. On March 5, 2025, President Trump signed an executive order honoring her life by renaming Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge to Jocelyn Nungaray Wildlife Refuge in Anahuac, Texas. Since Jocelyn's murder, her mother Alexis has been advocating alongside the Trump Administration and Senator Ted Cruz for stronger immigration laws.
- 2. Allyson and Lauren Phillips**— On February 22, 2024, Laken Riley, a 22-year-old nursing student, was murdered by an illegal alien during her run on the University of Georgia's campus. Her death was preventable, as the perpetrator had already been detained but released before he was arrested. Her mother, Allyson Phillips, and sister, Lauren, have been advocating for justice for Laken and reform to our immigration system. On January 22, 2025, Congress passed the Laken Riley Act, which mandates the detention of illegal aliens if they have committed a crime. One week later, President Trump signed this bill in honor of Laken Riley on January 29, 2025, the first legislation he signed into law as the 47th President.
- 3. Rick Harrison**— Rick Harrison, producer of Pawn Stars, is just one of the millions of parents who have lost a child to fentanyl poisoning. As a result of the illicit trafficking of fentanyl into the United States, Rick experienced the devastating loss of his son, Adam. In his first 100 days in office, President Trump implemented strong measures to dismantle cartel operations, enhance border security, and dramatically reduce the influx of fentanyl, reaffirming his commitment to protecting American lives from the dangers of illegal drugs.
- 4. Anne Fundner**— Anne Fundner is a loud voice in the anti-fentanyl movement. Anne tragically lost her son, Weston, after he took a fentanyl laced-pill that crossed the border during the Biden Administration. Since President Trump has taken office, he has signed 3 executive orders to combat the flow of illegal drugs, like fentanyl, from coming across our border. Anne Fundner joined President Trump on March 14, 2025, at the Justice Department and praised the President for his efforts, saying, "I feel like I can speak for the entire fentanyl-fighting community when I say thank you to President Trump."
- 5. Roberto Ortiz**— Roberto Ortiz is a dedicated Border Patrol agent who has served on the frontlines of the ongoing border crisis resulting from the Biden Administration's policies. While performing his duties, Ortiz and his partner came under fire from a Mexican cartel operative. Under President Trump's Administration, enhanced border security measures have significantly decreased illegal crossings and helped protect Ortiz and his fellow agents from danger.

6. Patty Morin— Patty Morin’s daughter, Rachel Morin, was brutally murdered by an illegal alien who entered the United States under the open-border policies of the previous administration. In the wake of this tragedy, Patty has emerged as a courageous advocate for border security and justice for victims of illegal migrant crime. Since taking office, President Trump has initiated the largest deportation of criminal illegal aliens in American history, delivering on his promise to secure our borders and protect American families.

7. Tammy Nobles— Tammy Nobles is the mother of Kayla Hamilton, who was brutally killed by an MS-13 gang member who entered the United States illegally during the Biden Administration. In the face of unimaginable loss, Tammy has become a fearless advocate for stronger border security. Under President Trump’s leadership, an aggressive crackdown on criminal illegal aliens has been launched, leading to their swift deportation. These decisive actions have made our cities and communities safer, standing as a powerful testament to President Trump’s unwavering commitment to protecting American families and putting Americans first.

8. Michelle Root— Michelle Root is the mother of Sarah Root, a 21-year-old Iowan who was killed by an illegal alien drunk driving in 2016. Instead of answering for his crimes, the illegal alien posted bail, was released from jail, and was never seen again. Fortunately, this criminal was found in Honduras and the Trump Administration worked with Honduran authorities to extradite him to the United States to face justice. President Trump also signed the Laken Riley Act, which included Sarah’s Law – introduced by Congressman Randy Feenstra from Iowa – to ensure that any illegal alien who harms or kills an American citizen is swiftly detained and prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. The Root Family is grateful to President Trump and Congressman Feenstra for honoring their precious daughter’s memory.

9. Cindy Romero— Cindy Romero is a former resident of Aurora, Colorado, a once quiet community that was overtaken by members of the violent Tren de Aragua gang. When her apartment complex of four years became extremely dangerous, Cindy’s concerns were met with indifference and outright dismissal from local authorities who encouraged her to take her story to the media. As a result of President Biden’s disastrous open-border policies, Cindy, a lifelong Democrat, voted for President Trump. In only 100 days, President Trump has reduced border crossings by 99% and followed through on his promise to deport dangerous illegal aliens. Cindy is grateful for President Trump who “didn’t disappoint me,” and she feels more confident knowing our President prioritizes the safety of American citizens over illegal aliens.

10. Olivia Hayes— Olivia is a young widow whose husband was killed by an illegal alien who had been driving drunk. Within his first 100 days, President Trump directed federal agencies to tighten DUI laws and immigration checks to help prevent future tragedies like Olivia's. For Olivia, it has been meaningful to see the government acknowledge her loss. Since advocating in her husband's memory, she's gained renewed hope that others may be spared her fate.

11. The Castner Family— Brad Castner tragically died in 2024 after an illegal alien crashed into his vehicle. This year, law enforcement announced that the illegal alien responsible for the fatal crash that killed Brad would finally be deported. Since day one, President Trump has moved quickly to secure the border, deport criminal illegal aliens, and help prevent further tragedies from President Biden's open-border policies.

12. Danielle Carter-Walters— Daniella Carter-Walter is the Vice President of Chicago Flips Red, a grassroots movement dedicated to shifting Chicago away from the liberal policies that have contributed to the city's decline and focused on educating Black Americans about how President Trump's policies have benefited their communities. As a longtime Chicago resident, Carter-Walter is deeply frustrated by the city's radical liberal leadership. In her powerful testimony before the House Judiciary Committee, she stated, "Sanctuary cities are anything but safe... they are magnets for migrants and cover for criminals." She believes that under President Trump's leadership, Chicago can once again become a city that is strong, secure, and prosperous.

13. Kelly Wilson— Kelly Wilson's family has owned and operated a small business in Colorado for 80 years, but after mass flows of illegal aliens started arriving in Denver under the Biden Administration, her family started discussing moving to another state. In the face of budget cuts to Denver's police force and sanctuary city policies that have failed Denver families, Kelly began speaking out for her community. Since day one, the Trump Administration has made cracking down on sanctuary cities and states a top priority. Today, communities like Kelly's are safer, thanks to President Trump's work to restore the rule of law.

14. Tanna and Mike Stuard— Tanna and Mike Stuard own Stuards Deer Processing and Taxidermy and General Store, in Terrell County, Texas, a small town close to the U.S.-Mexico border. Before President Trump, they would frequently find contraband and illegal aliens on their property and often struggled to get in touch with Border Patrol under President Biden. That's all changed because of President Trump's swift work to secure the border and restore law and order to America's border communities.

15. Doug Nicholls— In 2021, Mayor Doug Nicholls of Yuma, Arizona, declared a local emergency in response to the overwhelming surge in illegal border crossings into the city. Under President Biden's administration, the Yuma border saw an alarming average of 1,000 illegal crossings per day, with up to 31,000 illegal aliens crossing each month. However, just one month after President Trump took office in February 2025, Yuma experienced a dramatic turnaround. Border crossings plummeted by 99%, with only 243 illegal crossings recorded that month. Mayor Nicholls expressed his appreciation, saying, "It feels like a sigh of relief at this point," as the community finally saw the security they had long been denied.

16. Somerton Fire Chief Javier Hernandez— Fire Chief Javier Hernandez of Somerton, Arizona, witnessed firsthand the impact of the border crisis on his community. With thousands of migrants pouring in each day, the strain on local emergency services became overwhelming. Chief Hernandez recalled how residents in Somerton often faced delays in receiving critical emergency care, stating, "City of Somerton residents had to wait for an additional 20 minutes for an ambulance from the City of Yuma or San Luis to arrive." This delay in emergency response, coupled with the financial burden of supporting an influx of illegal aliens, placed an immense strain on local resources. The city was struggling to meet the needs of both its long-time residents and the illegal aliens. However, with President Trump's decisive action to secure the border, the situation in Somerton has drastically improved. In 2025, Chief Hernandez proudly reported that there had been zero calls from migrants for their emergency services. This dramatic shift in the number of calls is a direct result of the reduced illegal crossings and the strengthened border policies under President Trump.

17. Jim Chilton— The Chilton Ranch has been operated within the Chilton family for generations, a family legacy that Jim and Sue Chilton have preserved mere miles away from the Southern Border. However, under the Biden Administration, they were forced to shoulder the consequences of President Biden's border crisis. During April of 2024 alone, the Chiltons experienced 5,640 immigrant encounters on their ranch. The last time they checked with the Border Patrol, in April of this year, there were zero crossers over the course of three weeks. Thanks to President Trump's work to reverse the Biden administration's radical open-border policies, the Chilton family's beloved ranch and livelihood are no longer under threat.

18. Anne Fundner— Anne Fundner is a loud voice in the anti-fentanyl movement. Anne tragically lost her son, Weston, after he took a fentanyl laced-pill that crossed the border during the Biden Administration. Since President Trump has taken office, he has signed 3 executive orders to combat the flow of illegal drugs, like fentanyl, from coming across our border. Supporting Law Enforcement

19. DJ Daniel— DJ Daniel always dreamed of becoming a Secret Service agent. Tragically, in 2018, he was diagnosed with brain and spinal cancer that has forced him to undergo more than 13 brain surgeries. At President Trump's Joint Address to Congress, the President invited DJ as his guest and swore him in as an honorary Secret Service agent to make his lifelong dream come true.

20. Stephanie Diller— Stephanie Diller is the wife of NYPD Officer Jonathan Diller, who was killed on duty by a repeat offender. Since her husband's tragic death, she's continued to tell his story and ensure preventable tragedies like John's never happen again. In March, she was proud to join President Trump at his Joint Address to Congress and thanked him for fighting to restore law and order in America's cities.

21. Sheriff Bill Prummell— Bill Prummell, a 26-year veteran of law enforcement, currently serves as the Sheriff of Charlotte County in Florida. Under President Trump, American communities, like his, have strengthened their federal and local partnerships to address illegal immigration and remove criminal illegal aliens. The Trump Administration has provided greater support to sheriffs and law enforcement officials like Sheriff Prummell, empowering them to more effectively perform their duties and keep our communities safe.

22. Sergeant Betsy Brantner Smith— After serving as a law enforcement officer in Chicago for 29 years, Sergeant Betsy Brantner Smith now helps train police officers across the country. She credits President Trump for restoring law and order, revitalizing law enforcement optimism, and ending the burden of police vilification. The National Association for Police Officers praised President Trump's day-one executive order to equip local officers with the resources they need to combat criminal alien crime, to which Betsy declared, "The war on cops has ended."

Supporting Law Enforcement

23. Sheriff Chris Davis— Chris Davis has served as Tennessee’s Humphreys County Sheriff for nearly two decades. As a former S.W.A.T. Team member, K-9 Narcotics Detection Dog handler, and Chief Agent of the Twenty-Third Judicial District Drug Task Force’s Criminal Investigation Unit, Sheriff Davis understands the importance of law enforcement and has seen how illegal narcotics like fentanyl have devastated Tennessee’s communities and families. From the Abrego Garcia human smuggling case to Tren de Aragua’s presence across every major city in Tennessee, Sheriff Davis is grateful for President Trump’s work to reverse President Biden’s open-border policies and secure American communities.

24. Sheriff Steven McCain— In Grant Parish, illegal aliens are using drones to drop off drugs and other paraphernalia at a large federal prison. It’s been a significant problem for the prison, but now that President Trump has returned to the White House, the situation has changed. Sheriff McCain has noticed a sharp increase in cooperation from ICE, the United States Attorney’s Office, and other local officials. Working together, law enforcement from all levels will be able to crack down on these drones.

25. Dale Wagner— Dale Wagner, a sheriff from Adams County in Washington State, has long opposed his state’s sanctuary policies that grant refuge to dangerous criminal aliens. Thanks to President Trump’s executive action, the federal government is taking action against municipalities that defy federal law and empowering law enforcement officers to keep their communities safe.

Unleashing American Energy

26. Tony Campbell— Tony Campbell serves as the CEO and President of East Kentucky Power Cooperative. He and his colleagues have faced significant challenges under burdensome regulations that targeted the coal industry—an industry that has powered American homes and cities for generations. Through executive action, President Trump strengthened the reliability and affordability of American energy, safeguarded American jobs, and preserved critical coal plants, delivering on his promise to create jobs and uphold America’s energy independence.

27. Ben Dell— Ben Dell is the Chairman of Commonwealth LNG. President Trump has made unleashing American energy a key priority. One of his first acts as President was to end President Biden’s ban on LNG exports. In February, the Department of Energy issued the Trump Administration’s first LNG export authorization to Commonwealth LNG for a project in Cameron Parish, Louisiana. President Trump understands that unleashing the full potential of American LNG is how we strengthen our economy and restore energy dominance.

28. Charles Perez— Charles is the owner of a small oil and gas business that suffered under the Biden Administration’s war on American energy. Since President Trump took office, he’s been laser-focused on unleashing the full potential of American energy producers. Just within the President’s first 100 days, Charles has seen opportunities for his company increase and will soon expand his business in the coming months.

29. Travis Urbanovsky— Travis Urbanovsky works in the oil and gas industry and saw firsthand the devastating effects of burdensome regulations. Since taking office, Trump has worked to promote the growth and expansion of America’s energy sector, including LNG, and is committed to maintaining American energy independence.

30. Mike Sabel— In March, Venture Global announced an additional \$18 billion investment in its Plaquemines LNG facility in Louisiana. Unleashing American Energy

31. Matthew Sheppard— Matthew works at Expand Energy, an major LNG producer. Expand Energy commends President Trump for lifting the pause on LNG export permits and appreciates the administration's efforts to help consumers by ensuring an adequate supply of affordable, reliable natural gas.

32. Rich Nolan— Rich Nolan, president and CEO of the National Mining Association, praised President Trump's early executive actions to revitalize the coal industry. In April 2025, President Trump signed a series of orders to roll back burdensome regulations and invest in "beautiful, clean coal." Nolan applauded the move, noting that the orders "recognize the enormous strategic value of American-mined coal and embrace the economic opportunity that comes with energy abundance.

33. Steve Gordon— Steve, a small business owner, has witnessed firsthand the economic devastation caused by radical climate policies. Reviving American Manufacturing

35. Robby Bray— Robby Bray, owner of Antebellum Manufacturing, operates a major fence and rail manufacturing business based in Florida. He has been vocally supportive of the President's work to bring back manufacturing jobs and strengthen America's trading relationships.

36. Frank Windsor— In late 2024, the Biden Administration issued a rule that effectively banned an entire niche of American manufacturing: non-condensing tankless water heaters. The rule specifically targeted Rinnai America Corporation, the only U.S. facility producing these water heaters. Thanks to President Trump's leadership, the House passed a Congressional Review Act resolution to overturn the rule, keeping Rinnai's doors open and protecting nearly 300 American jobs.

37. Dino Mavrookas— President Trump has called for the restoration of America's maritime dominance, and Dino Mavrookas, CEO of the defense startup Saronic, has been a leader in answering this call. To help build the next-generation of autonomous vessels, Saronic acquired Gulf Craft, a Louisiana-based shipbuilder. By preserving Gulf Craft's skilled workforce, creating hundreds of new, good-paying jobs, and investing over \$2.5 billion to develop Port Alpha, Saronic is strengthening our economy, rebuilding America's maritime strength, and supporting our national defense.

38. Brian Pannebecker— On Liberation Day, Brian Pannebecker joined 20 United Auto Workers members at the White House to advocate for fair trade and American manufacturing. "I have watched plant after plant after plant in Detroit and in the metro Detroit area close," he said, "Donald Trump's policies are going to bring products back into those underutilized plants."

39. Joseph Knowles— Joseph Knowles is a Detroit autoworker for Stellantis who was laid off during the Biden Administration and later reinstated after President Trump's election victory. After attending President Trump's Joint Address to Congress, Knowles declared he had left the Democratic Party for good. "I got very good hope for the Republican Party," Knowles said, "More and more people are seeing the true colors of the Democrats."

Reviving American Manufacturing

40. Phillip Bell— Phillip Bell, President of the Steel Manufacturers Association, praised President Trump as a "champion of the domestic steel industry." After decades of unfair trade practices, he credits the Trump Administration for driving steel tariffs to turn America back into a "manufacturing powerhouse." In the aftermath of President Trump's new steel tariffs, he was pleased to see Hyundai announce a \$5.8 billion steel mill in Louisiana, demonstrating a growing domestic market for steel.

41. Brian Pavlack— Brian Pavlack, an employee at U.S. Steel's Mon Valley Works Clairton Plant, praised President Trump's Liberation Day for putting American companies first. After decades of enduring China's unfair and predatory trade practices, Brian believes the President's tariffs are exactly the action needed to help American workers compete globally and revitalize the U.S. steel industry.

42. Jeff Denard— For nearly three decades, Jeff Denard has worked as a steelworker at the Nucor Steel plant in Alabama. President Trump's investment in domestic steel has enabled him to raise a family, serve as a volunteer firefighter, and provide a loving home to foster children.

43. Robert Bradway— Robert Bradway, CEO of Amgen, unveiled a \$900 million investment in its Columbus, Ohio, facility this April. Bradway credited the investment as part of a resurgence of American manufacturing, which was made possible by President Trump's policies. He specifically touted the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act as the launching point for nearly \$5 billion in U.S. investment since 2017.

44. Leon Topalian— Leon Topalian leads the country's largest steel producer and scrap metal recycler, with \$31 billion in revenue over the last year. For years, the company has been negatively impacted by Chinese currency manipulation. Topalian applauded President Trump's bold action to improve America's trading relationships, and his commitment to finally push back against unfair trade practices and strengthen American manufacturing.

- 45. Kim Glas**— Kim Glas, President of the National Council of Textile Organizations, praised the Trump Administration's tariff reciprocity plan for countering the predatory trade practices of China, Vietnam, and other suppliers that have undermined the U.S. textile industry for decades. In particular, she applauded President Trump's work to close loopholes that will hold trade cheaters accountable.
- 46. Mark Yeager**— Mark Yeager is the founder of Red Land Cotton, a cotton producer in Alabama. Thanks to President Trump's tariffs, American-made products like Mark's are finally on a level playing field with those from other countries.
- 47. Brian Riley**— Brian Riley is the CEO of Guardian Bikes. Citing his support for President Trump's tariffs, Brian announced a \$19 million investment to move Guardian's bike production out of China and into Seymour, Indiana.
- 48. Lawrence Rosen**— Lawrence Rosen is the owner of Cra-Z-Art, the largest toy maker in the United States. Since Liberation Day, Lawrence has seen the benefits of President Trump's tariffs firsthand on domestic manufacturing. Because of President Trump's decisive action in the first 100 days, Rosen is expanding their domestic production by 50% and investing millions of dollars into factories across the country.
- 49. Jackson Adams**— Jackson recently entered the workforce. He was initially concerned that manufacturing might not be a viable long term option for a career. But now with President Trump's commitment to reviving America's manufacturing industry, Jackson is confident that the industry is here to stay and that his job will turn into a successful career.

50. Shane Keatts— Shane Keatts, a fifth-generation farmer and President of the Stewart County Farm Bureau, grew up on a small family farm in rural Tennessee, where he developed a deep respect for American farmers and the critical role they play in feeding the nation. Today, he proudly supports President Trump's executive orders on energy, believing they will boost demand for American-grown corn, and other ethanol-based commodities while helping lower the input costs of crop production.

Now, Kestenbaum is leading a Title VI lawsuit against his alma mater, arguing in the Harvard Crimson that American taxpayers should not subsidize discrimination. President Trump has sent a clear message to American universities that fail to protect Jewish students on campus: follow the law or lose federal funding.

61. Yasmeen Ohebsion— After experiencing disturbing acts of antisemitism on her campus under the Biden Administration, Yasmeen Ohebsion is partnering with other advocates to provide a platform for Jewish and pro-Israel students to take action against antisemitism. President Trump has displayed unprecedented leadership to enforce law and order and protect the civil rights of Jewish Americans, particularly on our country's college campuses.

Education

62. John Cahill— The Trump Administration has been a champion for school choice, taking action to expand educational freedom for all children. 63. Tiffany Justice— Tiffany Justice is the founder of Moms for Liberty and a committed advocate for parental rights in education. As a local school board member, she's helped combat DEI, critical race theory, and gender ideology in our public schools. Today, she's glad to see President Trump's actions to empower parents in their children's education and ensure every mom and dad has a seat at the table.

64. Nicole Neily— Nicole Neily is the founder of Parents Defending Education and a leading advocate for parental rights in public education. Protecting Religious Freedom

66. Pastor Gary Hamrick— Pastor Gary Hamrick became the target of anti-Christian bias when he and his church were charged by the IRS for so-called Johnson Amendment violations. Under President Trump, the Department of Justice has established a task force to eradicate anti-Christian bias in the federal government and safeguard the religious liberty of all Americans.

67. Paulette Harlow— Paulette Harlow, a senior citizen and committed advocate for the pro-life movement, was arrested and imprisoned for taking part in a peaceful demonstration outside an abortion clinic. Upon assuming office, President Trump issued pardons to Paulette and several others who had engaged in similar efforts to defend the sanctity of life.

68. Paul Vaughn— Paul Vaughn, a fervent pro-life advocate, was one of many peaceful demonstrators targeted by the Biden DOJ's Civil Rights Division and Reproductive Rights Task Force. For peacefully praying, singing hymns, and witnessing at an abortion clinic, Vaughn was facing more than a decade in prison. As part of his pledge to end politically motivated prosecution at the DOJ, President Trump stated it was a "great honor" to pardon peaceful advocates like Vaughn.

69. Dr. Scott Hicks— Dr. Scott Hicks, Provost and Chief Academic Officer at Liberty University, witnessed firsthand how the Biden Administration targeted the university with fines over its Christian worldview. In his first 100 days, President Trump has taken decisive action, directing the Department of Justice to establish a task force focused on eradicating anti-Christian bias within the federal government and reaffirming America's commitment to protecting religious liberty.

70. Bevelyn Williams— Bevelyn Williams was months into her years-long prison sentence when she received news of her pardon from President Trump. For demonstrating outside of an abortion clinic, Williams faced aggravated charges and a lengthy sentence and was even denied bail to care for her two-year-old daughter while awaiting appeal. Williams stated she relied on her faith and her devoted husband to carry her through.

71. Phil Mendes— Navy SEAL Phil Mendes was unjustly relieved of duty during the Biden Administration after the Department of Defense denied his request for a religious exemption from the COVID-19 vaccine. Today, President Trump is restoring honor to our nation's servicemembers by reinstating those who were discharged for refusing the vaccine.

72. Marc Fogel— Marc Fogel, an American schoolteacher, was wrongfully detained by Russian authorities in 2021 after being arrested on drug charges related to medical marijuana. Despite having a valid prescription in the U.S., he was sentenced to 14 years in a Russian prison. However, on February 11, 2025, Fogel was released and returned to the United States through a diplomatic deal negotiated by President Trump. He was warmly greeted by the President upon his arrival back to the United States and expressed his gratitude, saying, "I feel like the luckiest man alive."

73. Ksenia Karelina— After spending 15 months in Russian custody, Ksenia Karelina, a Russian-American ballerina, was released and returned to the U.S. on April 10, 2025. Karelina was arrested on charges of treason after donating to a charity that was supporting Ukraine. She was sentenced to 12 years in a Russian penal colony. President Trump negotiated her release as a part of a prison swap with Russia. Upon her arrival, she was greeted on the tarmac by her fiancé and expressed her deep gratitude to the President in a video that the White House posted.

74. George Glezmann— George Glezmann, a Georgia native and Delta Airlines mechanic, was arrested by the Taliban in 2022 during a planned tourist visit. Despite no formal charges being filed, Glezmann was held for over 2 years in an Afghanistan prison. On March 20, 2025, he was released as a gesture of "goodwill" by the Taliban following trilateral negotiations between Qatar, the U.S., and the Taliban. Upon returning to the U.S., he said, "I feel like I'm born again, I'm in debt to President Trump. Thank God he's in the White House and thank God he got me out."

75. Sagui Dekel-Chen— Sagui Dekel-Chen, an Israeli-American citizen, was among the 251 people taken hostage during Hamas' horrific terrorist attack on Israel on October 7, 2023. After being held captive for 498 days, he was finally released on February 15, 2025, as part of a prisoner exchange. Upon his return, Sagui was greeted by his wife, Avital, and their newborn daughter, Shachar, who had been born while he was in captivity. The name "Shachar," meaning "Hope" in Hebrew, was chosen to represent the enduring hope that sustained the family and their belief in his eventual safe return.

76. Keith Siegel— Keith Siegal is an Israeli-American citizen who was taken hostage during the October 7th terrorist attack. The United States played a critical role in negotiating the cease-fire and prisoner exchange between Israel and Hamas, which led to the release of Siegel on February 1, 2025, after 484 days in captivity. Keith thanked President Trump for his role in facilitating the deal that brought him home, saying, "President Trump, you are the reason I am home alive. You are the reason I was reunited with my beloved wife, four children, and five grandchildren. Thank you."

77. Paul and Christy Akeo— When Paul Akeo, US Navy Chief Petty Officer of 21 years, and his wife Christy were held without bail in a maximum security Mexican prison, Rep. Tom Barrett worked alongside the Trump Administration to secure their safe release.

78. Josh Sullivan— While delivering a sermon in South Africa, Pastor and missionary Josh Sullivan, of Tennessee, was kidnapped at gunpoint. Thanks to the firm leadership of President Trump's State Department, Sullivan was rescued in excellent condition and reunited with his family.

79. Sunita Williams— Sunita Williams, a U.S. astronaut, was among the crew members stranded in space for nine months due to a technical issue during a routine mission to the International Space Station. Under President Trump's leadership, and with the critical support of SpaceX, Williams and her team were successfully rescued and safely returned to the United States.

80. Butch Wilmore— After a technical malfunction left them stranded aboard the International Space Station for nine months, U.S. astronaut Butch Wilmore and his crew faced an uncertain future. Under President Trump's decisive leadership, and with the critical assistance of SpaceX, a daring rescue mission was launched, successfully bringing Wilmore and his team safely back to the United States.

81. Ryan Corbett— Ryan Corbett, an American citizen, was wrongfully detained by the Taliban for 894 horrific days, away from his wife, Anna, and their three young children. President Trump's team secured Ryan's release just one day into the President's new administration, finally reuniting Ryan with his family after two long years.

82. Payton McNabb— On September 1, 2022, tragedy struck during a volleyball match between rival North Carolina high schools when 17-year-old Payton McNabb suffered a life-altering head and neck injury caused by a spike from a male athlete who identified as transgender. Since taking office, President Trump has signed legislation protecting women and girls in sports, preserving the integrity of athletic competition and safeguarding young female athletes from injury and harm.

83. Macey Boggs— University of Wyoming volleyball player Macey Boggs was compelled to forgo the opportunity to compete in her final collegiate matches after facing transgender male athletes on opposing teams. Within his first 100 days in office, President Trump has taken decisive action to protect the fairness and integrity of women's sports, ensuring biological men are excluded from female athletic competition.

84. Chloe Cole— Chloe Cole, an activist and detransitioner, has become a leading voice against gender-affirming procedures for minors. 86. Suzanne felt compelled to speak out against the policy, however, her concerns with the school fell on deaf ears. Despite the pushback, Claire has bravely spoken out at school council meetings, advocating for the privacy and safety of young girls. Since taking office, President Trump has signed executive orders that ban gender reassignment surgery for minors and prohibit the prescription of gender-altering drugs for minors. Suzanne feels that the safety and well-being of children is finally getting the recognition it deserves, thanks to President Trump’s leadership on this issue.

87. Hayden Robichaux— Hayden Robichaux is the third generation of his family to serve in the military. But Hayden was forced to leave the U.S. Marine Corps after he refused to get the mandated COVID-19 vaccine. He was one of over 8,000 servicemen and women who were either forced out of the military or left on their own. President Trump’s early executive order to reinstate members of the military discharged for refusing to take the vaccine was a crucial first step in rectifying the damage caused by the mandate. The EO also called for these servicemembers to receive full back pay. Hayden praised President Trump’s policy citing servicemembers losing their pensions or having difficulties finding another good-paying job.

88. Ben Paulding— Ben hosts South Dakota’s first federally subsidized CPA Apprenticeship Program. After navigating months of red tape under the Biden Administration, he can finally onboard his first interns. Other Impacted Issues

Mark Block— Mark Block, a veteran Republican strategist from Wisconsin, recently uncovered that nearly \$1,000 had been fraudulently donated to ActBlue, the Democrat online fundraising platform, in his name. In total, at least 385 unauthorized donations were made to left-wing causes. In response, Mark filed a lawsuit against ActBlue, alleging racketeering activity. President Trump has taken decisive action to crack down on this illegal behavior, directing the Department of Justice to investigate ActBlue for alleged "straw donor" schemes and illicit foreign contributions.
